From Our Interim Pastor

Wang's Words

Last June, our son and daughter-in-law were married within the context of a beautiful, awe-inspiring Mass, filled with magnificent music. They are both musicians; our son is Music Director in a Catholic church and his wife teaches music in a Catholic school. Music was a huge part of their wedding. They hired a professional choir – The Mirandola Ensemble (check them out on YouTube).

The music flowing from the balcony in the back of the large Catholic church sounded like it was coming directly from heaven!

Now, why am I telling you this? Please hear me out.

The music was magnificent. There was not one bit of applause during the entire Mass. Had I bought a ticket to hear this group in concert, I would have most definitely applauded. In the context of worship, silence – awed silence – was the appropriate response.

You know where I'm going. Please hear me out!

St. John has so many talented musicians, it is a joy and a blessing when they share their gifts in worship. Really, this church is truly blessed to have such wonderful music, and such a variety of music! You know that. You are grateful. And I am sure that is why you applaud after each musical offering.

What if you didn't? (Hear me out!)

Twice recently, Alberto has respectfully asked for 15 seconds of silence after he sang a solo in worship – once when he sang an aria from Handel's Messiah, and again on Christmas Eve when he sang O Holy Night. Sometimes, silence is the best response.

I have talked to all of our musicians about this. They do not expect applause; in fact, sometimes it makes them feel awkward; are they supposed to take a bow? They are not performing for applause; they are offering their gifts for the glory of God.

I understand that sometimes spontaneous applause is appropriate [like when the woodwind quartet did that awesome postlude from the Nutcracker!]. When applause is more of an automatic response every time music is offered, I believe it loses something. Too much applause makes worship start to feel like a concert. (My opinion.)

Sometimes awed silence is the better response.

So I'm giving you a challenge – try some reflective silence when the gift of music is offered in worship. Then tell the musicians afterwards how much you appreciate them! Send them a note. Write a note for the newsletter – I'll start:

THANK YOU TO ALL OF OUR AMAZING MUSICIANS WHO GIVE OF YOUR TIME AND TALENT FOR THE GLORY OF GOD! THANK YOU FOR THE WAY YOU INSPIRE US ALL. WE TRULY APPRECIATE YOU!

Welcome to 2024! The new offering envelopes have been picked up by those requiring them. If you have not received your new envelopes, please call me or the church office and we can mail some to you.

2023 was an excellent year for giving. Almost everyone who pledged for the year met that pledge and gave above their pledged amount. If one compares pledged amounts to actual, we received 5% more, or 105% of pledged amounts.

For the current year 2024, 56 units have given pledges to the church totaling approximately \$200,000 for the year. The remaining 25/30 units will give an estimated \$43,000 for the new year. We are thankful for those pledges and for the financial support of all. As everyone has experienced, costs keep rising and we are thankful for all who are able to increase their giving to meet the church's operating and program expenses.



Key Card Policy

The purpose of this policy is to optimize safety and security for church members, guests, visitors, employees, tenants, vendors and all others who visit the church.

All key card requests will be directed to the Pastor, Moderator, or Facilities Chair, whichever is appropriate. Upon their approval, the Church Administrator will program each key card and log the key card information (name, key card number, date activated, etc.) on the key card spreadsheet. The Key Card Request form must be completed for each request.

Church members who are on committees and those who volunteer regularly can request one activated key card at a time. If the key card is lost, the replacement cost is \$10 (current cost, subject to change).

Church employees will be given one activated key card at a time. If requested, the Pastor can have 2 activated key cards at a time. If a key card is lost, the replacement cost is \$10 (current cost, subject to change).

Tenants can request the number of key cards they require. The request must be submitted and approved by the Moderator. If a key card is lost, the replacement cost is \$10 (current cost, subject to change).

Facilities will authorize the Church Administrator to provide a key card, if needed, to a vendor for the time it takes for the contracted work to be completed. The vendor will return the key card to Facilities or the Church Administrator.

PADS Site Director(s) will authorize all key cards for PADS volunteers.

Key cards will not be issued to church guests, visitors, or children (under 18 years of age). Lost key cards will be deactivated immediately after reported to the Church Administrator. Key cards that are no longer needed must be returned to the Church Administrator. The list of key card holders will be reviewed annually by the Pastor, Moderator and Facilities Chair.





Message from Treasurer

St. John continues to be in a strong financial position. Our generous congregation has faithfully supported the ongoing financial needs of our church through their pledges, weekly offerings and memorials. We also completed the capital campaign this year and are all enjoying the beautiful upgrades to our sanctuary and the other improvements to the building. Pledges and giving were 107% of budget for the year. This was an increase of 6% from 2022. Total income was 108.9% of budget, an increase of 10.7% from 2022. This is due in part from the income of the new preschool and by the generosity of our members. Our expenses resulted in a minor increase this year over 2022. This was primarily due to increased utility costs and the prep work required for the new preschool. We were 103.2% of the expense budget for 2023. While we budgeted a deficit of \$17,877 for 2023, our deficit in actual dollars was only \$1,996. Our balance sheet remains strong. We have about \$86,000 in unrestricted funds in the General Fund. The Building Fund has a balance of \$12,256.

Other ongoing projects:

- We submitted documentation for an Employee Retention Credit (ERC) and are awaiting results from the IRS.
- We applied for a security grant through the State of Illinois. This program is designed to help houses of worship increase building security. Our proposal for camera and intercom systems was accepted by the State. We are in the process of completing all requirements and hope to begin installation of equipment later in 2024.
