

Churches and Change...

I regularly receive emails from Convergence Church Consultants, who offer support and education to congregations and leaders. As St. John looks forward to calling a new pastor, which inevitably will involve change, I want to share some recent thoughts from Convergence CEO, Cameron Trimble, in response to the question, "What does it take for a church to change? Below are a few of her thoughts.

In my experience as a congregational consultant, creating change isn't a challenge for most congregations. Integrating change seems to be the stumbling block. Change management statistics suggest that approximately 70% of organizational change initiatives fail. I imagine many congregational leaders can attest to this reality.

As I outlined my thinking about change, I found my experience pointed to four conditions for integrating change:

The congregation must grant **trust** between leaders and participants sufficient to risk letting go of who they were in favor of a new way of being;

They create a culture that rewards the pursuit of new possibilities;

They **mediate differences** between ideas, opinions, and people as needed in service to the most generative outcome;

They **remediate conflicts** early to reduce risk to the people and possibilities involved.

In my experience, **trust** is the single most important contributor to change integration. **Trust** is the glue that holds human community together. It creates a sense of safety, belonging, and unity, all essential for navigating change effectively.

The Anti-Racism Discussion Group has concluded for this year. We finished Ruth King's book Mindful of Race, Transforming Racism from the Inside Out. We will bring King's Mindfulness practices into our study next year. The group will start up next October with a new book and will meet monthly on the 1st & 3rd Monday's. Facilities Committee

Building Updates: The ejector pit was cleaned out and it was determined that a new pump motor was required. The motor repairs will cost \$1,890. One toilet downstairs needed replacement for about \$900. We have also gotten several bids for painting the church exterior for approximately \$20,000. We also solicited bids for gutter repairs and some roof work related to fixing the gutters. The bid for this work was approximately \$30,000. Council is using this information to prioritize work and budget for next year. This summer we will be seal coating and re-striping the parking lot.

St. John Book Club



There are so many special aspects to our **Spiritual Life** at St. John and our weekly **Coffee Hour Fellowship** is at the top of the list. The time we gather after service each Sunday to catch up with our church family and welcome visitors is one of the things that attracted me to St. John 13 years ago. We are so grateful to all the individuals who host **Coffee Hour** by providing treats, and setting up and serving the coffee/tea and juice. I know it can seem overwhelming to host **Coffee Hour** but it does not have to be and anyone on the **Spiritual Life Committee** is available to assist you with set up and clean up. Also, the goodies do not need to be elaborate. **Coffee Hour** is really about spending some time together before we go back to our busy lives. **Coffee Hour** takes place every Sunday after the service whether there is a host or not. If there is no host for **Coffee Fellowship**, the **Spiritual Life Committee** will always make sure we have fresh coffee and juice available for our time together, but we may ask for your assistance in cleaning up when we are done.

This year we have taken some gradual steps to reduce our use of disposable kitchen items, to limit waste and to do our part in honoring God's creation. We are now using ceramic mugs, stainless steel cutlery and dishwasher safe beverage cups. There is a metal tray on top of the covered garbage bins in Fellowship Hall for you to place the used items after **Coffee Hour**. The items can then be placed in the dishwasher and set to the clean cycle. It is a fast and easy clean up and the mugs, cups and cutlery are then ready for the next church event or **Coffee Hour**.






Here is how we will be sharing that with the congregation:

Commitment Sunday is November 10. We ask you to turn in your pledge cards and time & talent sheets on this day as we celebrate together.


The congregation will be voting on the budget at the annual meeting in late January.

Pastor Judy's Tips for Going Green

Stop using single use plastic bottles. Use a refillable water bottle instead. If you need water for a crowd, use a thermal jug and paper cups.

Stop using plastic straws. Drink without a straw, or carry your own metal reusable straws. When ordering out, request "no straw".

Going out to eat? Bring your own container for leftovers. Too many leftovers go home in Styrofoam and plastic containers that end up in the trash. One church member told me she leaves a lunchbox and container in her car so she is always prepared! Great idea!

Buy reusable glass spray bottles and make your own cleaning products. Do away with the one-time plastic bottles and the harsh chemicals. https://www.chop.edu/news/10-non-toxic-diy-cleaning-products

Bring reusable cloth bags when you shop. Buy mesh bags to hold your loose produce (or don't use a bag at all if you're getting a single item). Stop using plastic food storage bags and use glass or reusable plastic containers. Reusable food storage bags are also available; use and wash and reuse.

Conserve water. Take shorter (or less) showers; turn off the faucet as you brush your teeth; collect rainwater to water plants; use a dishwasher instead of washing dishes by hand, if possible, and only run it when it is full; do full loads of laundry, not partial; periodically check faucets and pipes for small leaks. Be aware of how much water you are using.
